**883.1 CONGRATULATIONS**

## 883.2 MAYOR'S ANNUAL REPORT

The Mayor welcomed members to the 32<sup>nd</sup> annual meeting of Ballymoney Borough Council, stating "I want to take a few minutes to reflect on the activities and achievements of Council during the past 12 months.

During the year I was honoured, as Mayor, to represent the Borough at a variety of events, presentations, and functions and to add my support to the excellent work and achievements of many people and organisations.

I was pleased to support and host events to raise money for charity. £1371 was raised to support the work of Drop In Ministeries in Rwanda and the Kenyan School Project. I was also pleased to lend support to the fundraising efforts of the Twinning Association which raised £2375 towards its work.

I was overwhelmed by the magnificent public response from sports clubs, schools and individuals to my public appeal for sports shirts for children in Rwanda. We were able to ship out, through Drop Inn Ministeries, hundreds of sports shirts.

We were saddened earlier this year to learn of the passing of former colleague and long serving town Councillor, Bob McComb. Bob, who had 40+ years service when he retired from the Council in 2001, had a strong interest in the welfare of his local community. We record with gratitude his service.

It is with sorrow that we learned of the shock death of an honorary freeman, Dr. Robert Dunlop at the North West 200 practice this year. Robert was a road racing legend, a great ambassador for the sport and for his hometown. A much loved and highly respected son. He will be sadly missed.

The development of the Borough and improvement of services to citizens engaged our attention. Following a member workshop we adopted a new corporate plan. This sets out our vision, core values and business objectives for the period 2008-2011. As an employer we are working towards resolution of the single status issues to achieve fair and equitable treatment to all those we employ.

We had a number of achievements. The community as a whole shared in the success of the Sustrans Connect 2 Project in the Big Lottery Public Competition. Work is advancing on this and we look forward to celebrating its completion.

The Borough Services Directorate achieved considerable success in the fields of Home Safety, Fuel Poverty and Community Safety. £33,500 was secured for the delivery of a home safety equipment scheme and almost £60,000 devoted to increasing awareness and tackling fuel poverty. To date over £57,500 of fuel stamps have been sold through an innovative scheme and a number of other Councils are now following in the footsteps of Ballymoney.

In Community Safety there has been significant youth involvement and contribution to community life where young people engaged in a variety of activities, including the Peer Leadership programme, the Get BART Active Project and the Youth Intergenerational Drugs and Alcohol Project.

Recycling remains at the top of the agenda. During the year Council added brown bins to the range of options for recycling of waste. Environmental Services distributed brown bins to 7.000 households for the collection of garden waste.

To date, the scheme has been highly successful and well received by householders. Additional recycling centres were provided in Rasharkin village and at Drumaheglis Marina & Caravan Park. Up to 70% of waste in grey bins can now be diverted from landfill using blue bins, brown bins, civic amenity sites and community recycling centres. Our citizens deserve thanks for their contribution to achieving this target.

A number of Amenities projects were completed during the year:

- Play Areas at Bendooragh, Dunloy, Dunaghy
- Refurbishment of community centre at Killyrammer
- CCTV at Riada Stadium and Council Depot
- Paths and Car Park improvements at Riada Stadium
- The cycle link from Riverside Park to Leisure Centre and Riada Playing Fields
- Bus Shelters at Castle Street and Bendooragh
- 2 grass pitches at Riada Playing Fields
- The Lower Bann Canoe Trail was launched, providing a unique way to experience the River Bann.

The last year also saw service improvements completed at our Leisure Centre, with the commissioning of the new Health Suite. Energy saving projects were undertaken in the Leisure Centre during the year which included upgrading of sports hall lighting and the connection to natural gas.

As well as our local focus our Borough is outward looking and has continued to develop its international links. The Twinning Association continued its good work in support of our work in this area.

We had exchange visits between this Borough and Benbrook, Vanves and Douglas. These programmes develop our people, and their awareness, through experience and knowledge of other cultures.

I was also very pleased to welcome, recently, a civic delegation from South Africa and facilitate meetings with Dervock Community Association to explore the further development of the bond between the two communities through one of Dervock's famous sons, Kennedy McArthur.

On the development front we have been working with a cluster of Councils to develop strategies and action plans for the new European Programmes for Peace and Rural Development and progressing projects under the EU Interreg Programme. We continued to implement town centre marketing initiatives for both residents and visitors. During the year a new directory of town businesses and street map was added to our visitor website – [www.visitballymoney.com](http://www.visitballymoney.com)

We had devastating news during the year with the TYCO announcement that its Ballymoney plant is to close with the loss of over 200 jobs. And the loss of a further 200 jobs when Reid Transport in Cloughmills went into liquidation.

We continue to lobby relevant agencies to secure new investment and jobs in our borough. We are committed also to ensure that where people lose their jobs they

receive support from the relevant agencies on job opportunities, retaining and self-employment options and redundancy packages.

We also addressed a range of issues affecting our citizens.

- Proposed amendments to planning policies
- The post office closure programme
- Development of the rail network
- Natural gas pipeline investment
- We continue to keep a watching brief on applications for mineral prospecting licences and any attempts to progress lignite development

Looking forward to the year ahead, new projects planned include:

- Fit out of the museum
- New play areas at Derrykeighan and Druckendult
- Additional sand mattress pitch and extra car parking at Riada Playing Fields
- New computer software systems in environmental health and building control aimed at improving delivery of service
- upgrading of Council website to allow people to do business with us on-line.
- the Fitness suite at the leisure centre will be refurbished and equipment upgraded.

We continue to actively pursue the implementation of a major community facility in Cloughmills village. Our plans have hit the buffers recently but I intend to actively pursue the land and planning issues with renewed vigor. We must ensure that the needs of this village are addressed and that it is at least on a par with our other large village communities.

There are many other challenges ahead. Through our Borough Services Directorate we will continue work to combat the issue of fuel poverty with the promotion of the fuel stamp scheme, energy efficiency measures and the reduction of home accidents through the delivery of the home safety equipment scheme. The Community Safety Partnership will build on its success over the past three years to tackle anti social behaviour issues following the development of a new strategy and action plan.

There has been developments on RPA. In March the Environment Minister announced that the Stormont Executive agreed to reduce the number of Councils from 26 to 11. For us this means merging with Coleraine, Moyle and Limavady into a new super council. Elections to the new Councils are planned for 2011. This is a time of huge change in local government – for councilors as well as staff.

I hope that the changes will give the new councils a leading role in the shaping and development of local communities, and, at the same time, provide ratepayers with a modern and efficient service. This council's work will continue as the changes are implemented. The challenge for us is to ensure that the interests of citizens of the borough are kept to the fore in the negotiations and that the interests of councillors and staff are also given due regard.

In conclusion I want to thank my Deputy, Alderman Connolly, and my fellow councillors for their support during my term as Mayor. I also record thanks to the Chief Executive and his staff for their service to the Council. Thanks are due to the

press for their regular attendance at our meetings and communicating our plans and activities to our citizens”.

In concluding, the Mayor paid special thanks to the Office of the Chief Executive for their support.

### **883.3 ELECTION OF MAYOR**

Councillor Finlay submitted a letter of resignation from the office of Mayor to the Chief Executive and left the Chair.

The Deputy Mayor assumed the Chair, thanking the Mayor, members of Council and the Staff of the Chief Executive for their support throughout his period of office.

It was proposed by Alderman Cousley, seconded by Alderman Campbell

***that Councillor Finlay be re-elected to the office of Mayor for the ensuing year.***

It was proposed by Councillor McKay, seconded by Councillor McGuigan

***that Councillor Cavlan be elected to the office of Mayor for the ensuing year***

A Vote was taken with Councillor Cavlan receiving 3 votes and Councillor Finlay receiving 11 votes.

**Councillor Finlay was declared elected Mayor for the ensuing year.**

Councillor Finlay took the Chair and signed the declaration of acceptance of office. He thanked all for re-electing him as Mayor and said that he would carry out his duties to the best of his ability for the benefit of Council and the people of the Borough.

### **883.4 ELECTION OF DEPUTY MAYOR**

The Mayor invited nominations for the office of Deputy Mayor.

It was proposed by Councillor McCamphill, seconded by Councillor Kennedy

***that Alderman Connolly be re-elected as Deputy Mayor for the ensuing year***

It was proposed by Alderman Campbell, seconded by Councillor Stevenson

***that Alderman Cousley be elected as Deputy Mayor for the ensuing year***

Speaking in support of Councillor McCamphill's motion, Councillor Kennedy urged members to consider Alderman Connolly's long-serving membership to Council and his good work within the Borough during his term in office. He expressed the view

that re-election of Alderman Connolly as Deputy Mayor would promote good relations and send out a positive message to residents in the borough.

A vote was taken with Alderman Connolly receiving 6 votes and Alderman Cousley receiving 10 votes.

**Alderman Cousley was declared elected Deputy Mayor for the ensuing year.**

#### **883.5 ELECTION OF STANDING COMMITTEES, APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS TO BOARDS, MEMBERS TO COMMITTEE ASSOCIATIONS AND OTHER BODIES.**

A list of existing membership of Standing Committees and Outside Bodies (attached as Appendix 1) was circulated.

The Chief Executive advised members that whilst almost all positions are existing, North East Peace III Joint Committee and Partnership are new organisations. Council has been asked to appoint two members to each organisation and it is recommended that Council consider nominations on a cross-party basis and address gender, based on SEUPB guidance. Whilst not mandatory, it is further recommended by SEUPB that those nominated serve on both organisations.

The Chief Executive also clarified that the North West Regional Waste Management Group/SwaMP was no longer in existence and Council had representation as an observer on NILGA's Executive Committee, the current representative being Councillor Robinson. He advised that should party members wish to switch representatives on Council standing committees, changes should be notified to the Chief Executive.

Alderman Simpson expressed the view that elected members should make every effort to attend bodies which they are appointed to.

It was proposed by Councillor McCamphill, seconded by Councillor Stevenson and **AGREED:**

***that appointments to Standing Committees be elected en-bloc for the following year in accordance with the details set out in appendix 1.***

It was proposed by Alderman Connolly, seconded by Alderman Cousley

***that Councillor McCamphill be nominated to the North East Peace III Joint Committee and North East Peace III Partnership.***

It was proposed by Councillor McGuigan, seconded by Councillor McKay:

***that Councillor Cavlan and Councillor Robinson be nominated to the North East Peace III Joint Committee and North East Peace III Partnership.***

It was proposed by Councillor Robinson, seconded by Councillor Stevenson:

***that Alderman Simpson be nominated to the North East Peace III Joint Committee and North East Peace III Partnership.***

Whilst thanking Councillor McGuigan and Councillor McKay for their proposal, Councillor Robinson, in view of her commitments to other organisations, declined her nomination. Councillor McGuigan withdrew his nomination of Councillor Robinson.

A ballot was taken with voting as follows:

Alderman Simpson	11 votes
